

Outreach Corner

Youth Homelessness in Indianapolis

Recently a new report was released that paints a disturbing picture of homelessness for people aged 25 and under in Indianapolis, as reported in the Indy Star April 7, 2019 edition. Data from the Coalition for Homelessness Intervention and Prevention (CHIP) revealed that young people experiencing homelessness are disproportionately African American and that nearly half reported having a serious mental illness.

The Youth & Young Adult Point-In-Time Count was conducted on Nov. 7, 2018, and gives a snapshot of the city's unsheltered population age 25 and younger. Details of the report can be found at https://www.indycoc.org/youth-young-adult-point-in-time. Outreach teams found 183 youths and young adults were experiencing homelessness at that particular time, an increase of about 50% from the previous study in 2017 (though the increase is largely due to a change in methodology).

An analysis of the results shows:

- A majority of the youth counted (65 percent) were African American, while 24 percent were Caucasian.
- More than half were male, 41 percent were female and 6 percent were transgender or gender-non-conforming.
- Nearly 90 percent of those counted were sheltered in emergency facilities, transitional housing or safe havens.
- Forty-six percent reported having a serious mental illness and 24 percent reported having some form of disability.
- Nearly half were unemployed, and 61 percent lacked a high school diploma.

According to CHIP's Executive Director Chelsea Haring-Cozzi, research has shown that homeless youth are at a higher risk for abuse, sexual exploitation, violence, substance abuse and various health issues, including anxiety, depression and suicide. Young adults are also more likely to put themselves at risk or in dangerous situations to find housing, which increases the likelihood of trauma.

Indianapolis does have a plan to address homelessness among youth and young adults, and a new shelter facility specifically to aid LGBTQ young adults will open soon. But the roots of this problem reach back into broader issues of fair housing, mental health care, disabilities, and other structural barriers.

Our continued thanks to John Platt for this role in supporting this outreach. John is a parishioner and owner of Perennials Plus in Westfield. He has been a devoted supporter of the IHM garden. He generously donates plants and seedlings to the garden each season. We are looking for someone to take over the leadership for this outreach project.
