





Outreach Corner

Efforts on the way for better IHM Outreach

This is a "heads up" about an upcoming invitation to join in an initiative to make IHM Outreach even more impactful and sustainable. Look for more information in this space next week, and a brief invitation at the end of Masses on the first weekend in November. In preparation, here is a reprint of a past Outreach Corner article on this theme.

The Four Categories of Volunteering The non-profit organization BRiCKs Alliance, Inc. has provided a "Poverty Simulation" for IHM's Confirmation candidates and many of their sponsors, as well as for the whole parish in the past. The people at BRiCKs encourage us to think of volunteering in four different categories, all of which are very important. They are:

GIVE

Provide basic needs (clothing, food, money, etc.). I have something from which others can benefit.

DO

Provide time, skills-based support, etc.

I really do not know what it is like to be in another's situation, but I provide support in ways that I hope will help.

ENGAGE (Volunt-Hearing)

My friend needs my assistance but they define what they need. Realization that this is part of my life, not a 'project'.

I learn from the relationship about myself and my community (two-way relationship!).

ADVOCATE

I have a broader understanding of my community and I learn from my relationships about systemic barriers. I am dissatisfied with the current state.

For many of us, our volunteering tends to fall into the first two categories. Both research and those experienced in outreach say, however, that the third and fourth categories are essential for truly lasting benefits.


