

Outreach Corner

The Loss of the Middle Class – Part 4

Two books, one recent and one a few years ago, have highlighted the loss of the American middle class and what it has meant to American lives. One book is *Our Kids: The American Dream in Crisis* by Robert Putnam. The other book is *Tightrope* by Nicholas Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn. This is the second of four Outreach Corners on these books and the messages each has for American society.

Many solutions to the problems leading to and resulting from the loss of the middle class have been offered. Both Putnam and Kristof/WuDunn have offered some. From Putnam's "Restoring the American Dream" here are some strategies to increase mobility from poverty:

1. Change the narrative. At least three prominent narratives about poverty and mobility persist: people in poverty have no one to blame but themselves, people in poverty are helpless victims, and truly exceptional *rags-to-riches* stories prove that the American dream is still achievable. All three narratives are overly simplistic and inaccurate.
2. Create access to good jobs: Everyone who is willing to work should have access to a path to a good job.
3. Ensure zip code is not destiny: Every child and adult should have the chance to thrive in a place of opportunity and safety within a caring community.
4. Provide support that empowers. The support offered should give people the chance to control their destiny and take responsibility for their own actions.

Kristof & WuDunn offer many actions including:

1. Become a mentor; males are especially needed to mentor boys and young men.
2. Contribute to organizations working to end poverty through supporting youth and adults at risk [including St. Vincent de Paul and the United Way].
3. Support education for at risk youth, including preschoolers.
4. Become an advocate for organizations who support ending the systemic issues causing poverty.
5. Work with others in your local community/church/club to address local issues.
6. Volunteer at a homeless shelter [or groups like the Interfaith Hospitality Network].
7. Use your own resources to support local needs, whether for local jobs or local services.

As Catholics we have guidance on these problems from Catholic Social Teaching (see www.usccb.org/beliefs-and-teachings). We have an obligation to work to improve life in America for all of our brothers and sisters, and especially the needy.
