Outreach Corner

150 Years of Housing Discrimination

Good housing is a basic requirement for a good life. Where you live impacts school choices, food availability, parks and open spaces, as well as access to health care and other essential services. This is the first of two Outreach Corner articles about systemic racism in housing. This first article presents some of the history of housing discrimination, starting in 1865.

After the Civil War only 30,000 Blacks owned small plots of land, compared to 4 million who did not, because an 1865 federal law rescinded the government's promise of 40 acres of land for former slaves. These 4 million Blacks largely resorted to renting the farm land of their previous master in exchange for a "share" of their crop. This system of "sharecropping" tied farmers to their former master because they were legally obligated to buy all farming materials from and sell all their farming crops to their former master, usually at disadvantageous prices.

From 1865 on, Blacks could have their land seized to pay sharecropping debts, or simply because white landowners declared that Black farmers or businesses were in debt. Blacks could not fight these charges because they were legally prohibited from suing whites in court.

The National Housing Act of 1934 guaranteed federally-backed loans to whites and legally refused loans to Blacks and anyone else who chose to live near Black neighborhoods. This practice, known as "redlining", targeted entirely Black neighborhoods and identified them as "Grade D". This made it nearly impossible for appraisers in the private sector to do business in Black neighborhoods because all the residents were considered bad credit risks. In addition, from 1949-1970, one million people lost their land to use of the power of eminent domain which allows local governments to seize private property. About 70 percent of these families were Black.

The next Outreach Corner will complete this history of systemic racism in housing, and describe some possible solutions.

Faith Formation Of Children

In order to develop a life-long relationship with God and a strong faith that translates into action, it is important that every person receives a solid foundation of religious education in their childhood. It is the responsibility of the parents to be the first teachers of their children in the faith. The parish of IHM is dedicated to help parents in their efforts and does so through the Sunday Faith Formation program. All children from **Kindergarten age to 8th grade** should be enrolled to ensure continuous growth and maturity of faith.

Registration is required. Please go to www.ihmindy.org to register online on or after September 1, 2020. The fee is \$50.00 per child with a family cap of \$150. First Class is September 20, 2020. Children in 2nd grade will be prepared to receive their **Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion**. There is an additional fee of \$75 to register for this. These fees can be waived if necessary. Please talk to Ute Eble or Father Bob to receive the code to waive the fees.

In times of COVID-19:

Because of the special circumstances we find ourselves in this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are offering our children the option to participate in the Sunday Faith Formation either in-person with a volunteer teacher, or at-home with the help of their parents.

The at-home option is based on the same curriculum as the in-person teaching and will include working with the text book, multi-media, and doing assignments that connect the family to the IHM community.

In-person instructions is scheduled to follow the 10 a.m. / 9.30 a.m. Mass and will follow the COVID-19 safety protocols recommended by the CDC and the local authorities (e.g. wearing masks, physical distancing, staying home when showing symptoms). If school closures are mandated, in-person instruction will switch temporarily to at-home instruction.

Please note that at this time we cannot offer a religious education program for children of pre-school age. This is temporary during the pandemic, and we will gladly provide parents with support and faith formation materials to work with their pre-schoolers at home! Are You Interested In Becoming Catholic?

Are you an adult interested in becoming Catholic? Are you baptized Catholic but never received First Communion or the Sacrament of Confirmation?

You are invited to join RCIA, starting September 14! We will meet once a week on Mondays from 7 to 9 pm, hopefully in person.

RCIA, i.e. the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the Catholic Church's way of initiating new members. It consists of appropriate spiritual formation for each interested individual and the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation, i.e. Baptism, First Holy Communion, and/or Confirmation after approximately one year of preparation. In most cases, the initiation of new members is celebrated at the Easter Vigil.

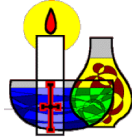
