

The Church's View on Elections

We are called as Christians to help those in need. This includes both helping to provide the basics to those in urgent need, and also to work for <u>systemic</u> changes that will give those in need an improved chance to sustain themselves. The most fundamental way for us to work for systemic change is to vote. Election Day is Tuesday, November 3. Too many fellow Hoosiers do not bother to vote, yet the election outcomes affects all of us.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops published an updated booklet in 2020 called "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility". A few key points of that booklet are:

- Our approach to contemporary issues is first and foremost rooted in our identity as followers of Christ and as brothers and sisters to all who are made in God's image. For all Catholics, including those seeking public office, our participation in political parties or other groups to which we may belong should be influenced by our faith, not the other way around.
- The Church does not endorse individual political candidates. Rather, its message focuses on the principles of Catholic Social Teaching. As noted recently in this space, the principles are:
 - 1. The life and dignity of every human person
 - 2. A call to family, community and participation
 - 3. Both rights and responsibilities for all
 - 4. An option for the poor and vulnerable
 - 5. The dignity of work and the rights of workers
 - 6. Solidarity with all the human family
 - 7. Care for God's creation
- We are urged to understand each candidate's position on these issues and to prayerfully consider this information when we cast our vote.
