Fitting for Lent: A Reflection from our Bible Study *Jesus – The Way, the Truth, and the Life*

In session 8 of our current Bible Study we learned how Jesus' road to glory as King of King and Glorious Son of Man is the path of suffering. He wins the prize by losing himself, by giving himself away. His disciples are meant to accompany him to glory, but their road has to be the same road as his. Discipleship means sharing all things with the Master, even his cross.

It is not so hard to accept that Christ had to suffer to win our salvation. It is harder to accept that we are called at times to suffer with him. What tends to be our immediate reaction when hardships, trials, and suffering appear in our life as unavoidable consequences of living out our vocations as disciples? Do we respond with frustration? Or is our first instinct to give thanks for them and rejoice (James 1:2)?

During Lent, begin or renew the practice of consciously uniting the unpleasant, challenging, difficult aspects of your life to the sacrifice of Christ and offering your labors and sufferings through him to the Father. Do this especially every time you participate in Mass. Mentally place this offering on the altar during the presentation of the gifts, that it may become more fruitful by being joined to Christ's sacrifice.
