#### **Outreach Corner**

#### Lasting Impacts of Segregation and Redlining

Recent reports from the University of California and SAVI Program at the Polis Center of IUPUI highlight the impact of systemic racism from the Jim Crow era on lives and neighborhoods now. The UC study, part of the Roots of Structural Racism Project, took several years of investigation. Its findings are stark: 81% of U.S. metropolitan regions with at least 200,000 residents were more segregated in 2019 than they were in 1990. The Midwest and mid-Atlantic were the most segregated areas of the country, followed by the West Coast. Critically, the study also found that key outcomes for residents in segregated communities – including income, home values and life expectancy – remain worse than those in more integrated areas.

In Indianapolis, analysis by SAVI similarly found lasting impact from segregation policies. SAVI directly measured discriminatory actions using segregationist policies (redlining starting on the 1930s) and their results (racial segregation in neighborhoods of the 1990s). They measured segregation in the 1990s rather than now because they wanted to examine long-term impacts of segregation as the cause of quality of life outcomes. Therefore, it is important to measure segregation at a time before the effects measured. This allows prediction of contemporary economic opportunity, health outcomes, and environmental conditions resulting from racial inequities having partial origins in segregationist policies.

The results for Indianapolis are extensive and broad, but overall show:

- Redlining perpetuated long-term segregation
- Redlining and segregation lower earnings
- Segregation explains worse health outcomes
- Segregation results in worse environmental outcomes for people of color
- Redlining contributed to income disparities
- Redlining and segregation have impacted both violent crime and police violence

Most of the results are correlations and not direct causation. Nevertheless, significant negative effects today can be related to redlining and segregation policies of the 1930s-1960s era.


