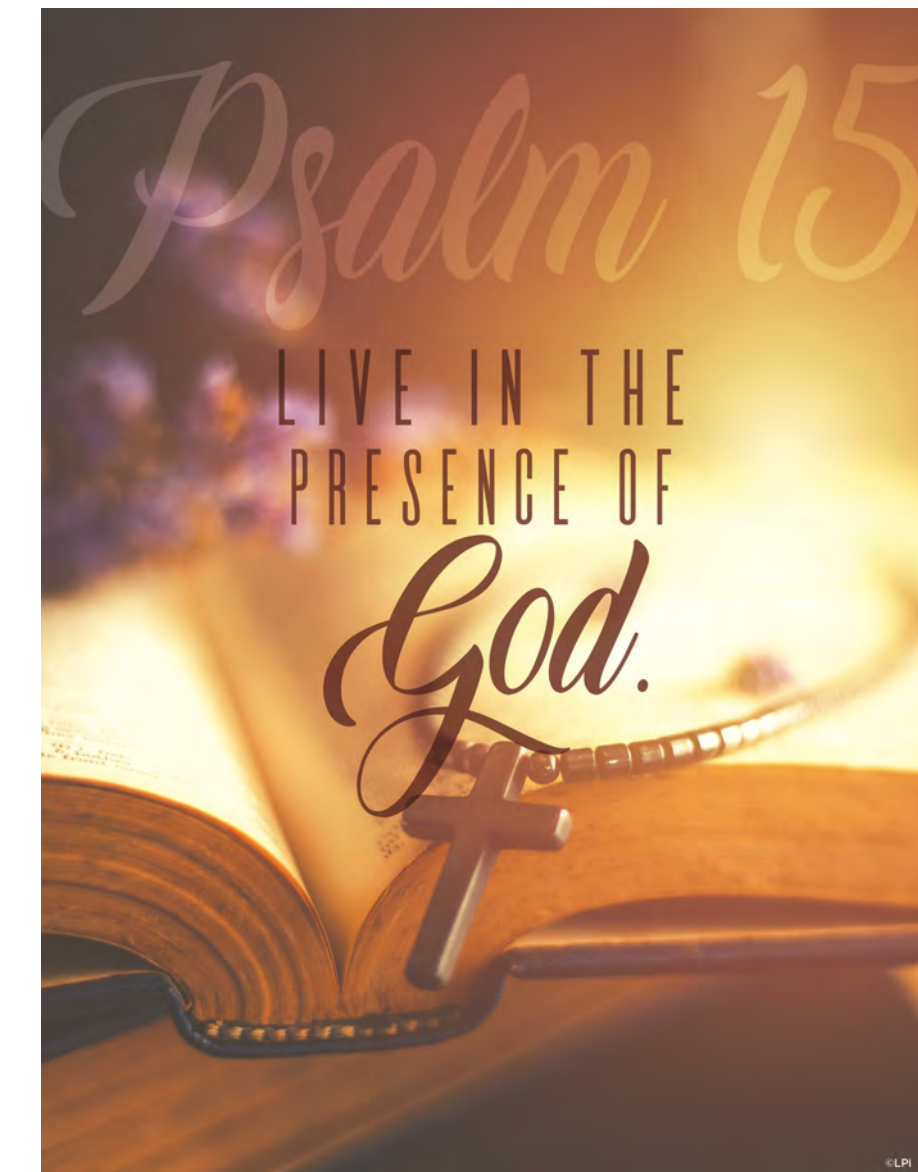

Sacred Relics Of The Saints: Treasures Of The Church

Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on **Thursday September 2** at 6:30 pm beginning in the Church. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will be here with an extraordinary Vatican collection of over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be a portion of the Veil of Our Lady and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. Throughout history, many healings have been worked in the presence of relics; and thousands have occurred through this ministry. Do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession. 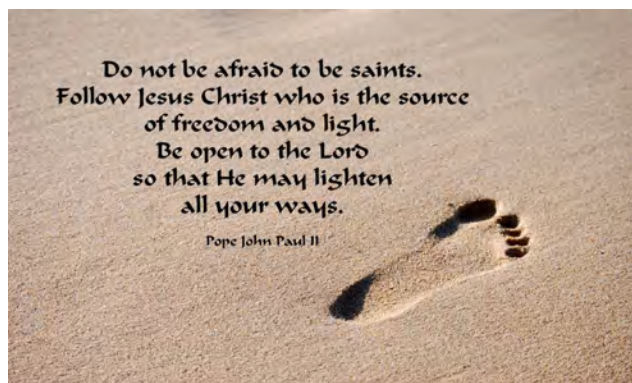


St Vincent de Paul Meetings!

Outreach Corner

The Top 12 Solutions To Cut Poverty in the United States

In a recent report, the Center for American Progress, a nonpartisan policy institute, listed 12 ways to cut poverty in the United States. This is the third of four Outreach Corner articles based on this report. This and future articles will include details on some of the 12 solutions proposed in the report.

Since the 1960s, America has made major strides in poverty reduction, and yet, there are still 35 million people living in poverty in the United States. What's more, poverty would be twice as high if not for decades of significant investments through Social Security, unemployment insurance, nutrition assistance, and low-income tax credits, among other successful anti-poverty programs. However, the concerning reality is that the COVID-19 pandemic and associated economic fallout obliterated those gains, putting individuals and families at a greater risk of being pushed into poverty.

The next four policy solutions that Congress can use to cut poverty and boost economic security for all in an equitable way are in brief:

5. **Increase worker power to rebalance the labor market** Research shows that unions increase workers' wages and benefits, boost economic mobility in future generations, decrease poverty, improve workers' general well-being, and close gender and racial wage and wealth gaps.
6. **Make permanent increases to the child tax credit and earned income tax credit** Two of the nation's most effective anti-poverty tools, the child tax credit (CTC) and earned income tax credit (EITC), lifted 7.5 million Americans out of poverty in 2019.
7. **Support pay equity to create a fair labor market** Equal pay ensures that workers are paid fairly. In 2019, women working full time, year-round [earned just 82 cents](#) for every \$1 earned by their male counterparts.
8. **Invest in affordable, high-quality child care and early childhood education** More than half of all Americans live in a child care desert, where child care shortages lead to waiting lists, job disruptions, and fewer mothers in the paid labor force.

As Catholics, working for social justice should be a priority. These proposed solutions offer ideas where to work.
