

Faith First presents Stations of the Resurrection Sunday, May 1 @ 4:00 pm

What are they?

- These are 14 Stations that follow the life of Jesus from the Resurrection to Pentecost
- They are also known as Via Lucis or Stations of Light
- They are prayed in the same fashion as the Stations of the Cross

Why have I never heard of them?

- They are based on Scripture, but were only compiled in the 1980s by an Italian priest.
- They were promoted by Pope John Paul II in 2000 during the Year of Jubilee.

Why pray them?

- They focus on light and hope
- It is a prayerful way of journeying with Jesus from his Resurrection to Pentecost
- Our Salvation story does not end with the cross; by Jesus' cross and the Resurrection, we are redeemed


