



Gospel Meditaion

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Jesus went to those most in need. He forgave the sinner, ate with the outcast, defended, and fed those who were poor and hungry. He worked for true justice, risked being unpopular, willingly accepted suffering and death, and always stayed connected with his Abba, Father. Jesus also consistently reminded folks that God's compassion, love, and mercy trump everything, even the law. This is the Christ that the Eucharist calls us to be. As we look around our churches, our towns and cities, and our world, there are many people who need to see the face and body of Christ. Some of those most in need may be right within our families. But it is always in the poorest of the poor and those most vulnerable that we find the greatest need. There are many who cannot function on their own. When the gift of the Eucharistic Christ takes root in our hearts, we can more readily see the face of Christ in others.

Many people are vulnerable. Highest on that list are the homeless. They show us the face of Christ. Whatever the cause, to have no place to go and no place to call home takes a toll on the human spirit. For Jesus when there were hungry people, they were fed. God asks us to do the same ... feed people. There are many who are hungry physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Gifted by the Eucharistic presence of Christ, we can bring them Christ. Who are the hungry around us and how can we feed them?

When someone is hurting, you comfort them. When someone is hungry, you feed them. When someone needs clothes, you provide them. When someone is cold, you warm them. When someone is in prison, you visit them. With over a million people who are homeless and over a quarter of them children, it is important to ask the question, "why?" and strategize for ways to lessen or alleviate the problem. Nevertheless, we are not off the hook for responding to the immediate needs that present themselves at our doors. Whether a person's current station in life is self-imposed or the result of being victimized, they are sacred vessels. We cannot lock the door and send them away and still believe we bear the Eucharistic presence of Christ. It doesn't work like that.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ)

Sunday, June 19, is not only Father's Day, but we also celebrate the solemnity of Corpus Christi. We honor in a special way the real presence of Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist. As Catholics, when we say that we believe in the real presence, is that we trust in Jesus' words recorded in the Gospel of John, chapter 6, where he says in verses 53 to 56

Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats[s] my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.

and also his words from the Last Supper that we hear at each Mass and that transform the bread and the wine into Christ's Body and Blood: "Take and eat; this is my body" and, when handing the cup of wine: "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins."

While we can not notice a difference with our senses between the unconsecrated host and the host that is the Body of Christ (and likewise with the wine and the Blood of Christ), through the words of the priest (who has received this faculty through ordination) and the power of the Holy Spirit, the substance of the bread and wine truly change. When we receive communion, we receive the whole person of Christ, his Body, Blood, soul and divinity.

When there are consecrated hosts in the tabernacle (which you can tell by the red light next to it), then Christ is present in the Church. And during a Eucharistic procession, as it is going to happen in Indianapolis on Sunday, when the bishop or a priest carries the monstrance with a consecrated host, the Son of God himself is there, "in person", so to speak.

Sometimes this is hard to believe for us, but one person's doubt is one of the reasons for this solemnity. In 1263, Peter of Prague, a German priest, during a pilgrimage to Rome, stopped at the Church of St. Christina to offer Mass. While he was a holy and devout man, he harbored doubts about the Real Presence. He had barely spoken the words of Consecration when blood started to seep from the consecrated host and trickled over his hand onto the altar and the corporal. The priest was confused and at first attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and went to tell Pope Urban IV what happened. The pope ordered an investigation, and when all the facts were ascertained, the host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of blood where brought to him to be placed as relics in the cathedral. You can still see the linen corporal in the Cathedral of Orvieto. The next year, Pope Urban IV instituted this solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and we are all invited to celebrate it and renew our faith into the real presence.


