

PRAYING WITH THE SONGS WE SING by Carey Landry

As the "interim director of music" at IHM, I have been asked to write a short column, from time to time, on Music in the Liturgy. As a title for this column, I have chosen "Praying with the Songs We Sing" because that is what I believe we do when we sing together at Mass. St. Augustine famously wrote: "To sing is to pray twice." For more than thirty-three years, and again now, Carol Jean and I, along with our dedicated musicians, singers, and choirs at IHM, have sought to bring "prayerful music" to the liturgies.

In doing so, we choose music "on purpose," as we seek to integrate the music into the liturgy. By that I mean that we don't just sing "any songs." We prayerfully consider the readings from the Word of God, given to us by the Church, and choose hymns and songs that enhance the readings, that lead us to reflect upon the readings, and that acclaim the various parts of the Mass. We also pay close attention to the "mood" of the liturgy: songs, for example, that lead us to "quiet waiting" during Advent...becoming songs of joy during the Christmas season...more penitential during Lent...exuberant songs of new life during the Easter season...and, as we go through Ordinary Time, we allow the Word to lead us in our choice of music week to week.

We begin a new liturgical year this Advent, and we introduce a new "JourneySongs" Hymnal to the parish, a more "permanent" hymnal. No one hymnal can contain all the songs we want to sing, so there is also a "Supplement" at the back of each hymnal with newer songs composed after the hymnal was published.

As companions on the journey, let us continue to sing strongly together, to praise Our Beloved God, to allow songs of faith to touch our hearts and feed our spirits, drawing us closer together in the Body of Christ.

IHM Leader in Me Program - On Friday November 11, Meg Hunter-Kilmer visited Immaculate Heart of Mary! She came to IHM to showcase her book, *Saints Around the World*. Her book tells the story of over 100 saints from over 60 different countries. The entire school participated in asking her to read about a saint that each had different characteristics that make them unique. The students were all able to listen to different saints from Meg's book. It was interesting to think about how saints can come from anywhere. You don't have to come from a certain place or have a certain power to make a difference in your religious community." -Devin, Class of 2023

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 4th - Second Sunday of Advent - At sixty years of age, Maria and Paul had a beautiful life. High school sweethearts, they had four children, five grandchildren, a successful business, good friends and a fabulous beach house. They felt very blessed. Their strong faith in God saw them through some difficult challenges. Without warning, Paul died suddenly. Maria was devastated. Why did God do this? Why did God allow this to happen? An indescribable depth of sadness weighed heavily upon her heart. She felt betrayed by the God she thought was looking out for her. She was overwhelmed by despair. Have you ever experienced such incredible and deafening sadness? Where is God in all of the pain?

We often want God to fix things or intervene and change nature's course. When He doesn't act as we desire, it shakes our faith. We do not always understand or appreciate why things happen as they do. There is much that is beyond our control. John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus and Jesus is the way to God. There is something more going on in life than what we can see with human eyes. We are on a sacred path, and God is with us. God is with us in our confusion, suffering, doubts, and intense sadness. Jesus announced God's vision for humanity and taught people to see God and themselves for who they are. There is a way through and beyond all hardship and suffering. God does not abandon us.

God has a clear vision for the future, both for us individually and for our world. It is a vision of harmony and gentleness where all will live as one and the "wolf shall be a guest of the lamb." God is not indifferent. He is the God of "endurance and encouragement." In God, we see what we may be, what may come and who we can become. When Maria opened herself to God's creative presence, she learned to trust. She began to realize that she could endure more than she had imagined. She also discovered a spark of encouragement, bringing her through the sadness to where she could be. In retrospect, Maria knew that God's reassuring presence was with her.
